#### ENTRY FEE

#### MEET FORMAT / SEEDING INFORMATION

Meet Type - Level 2: Time Final Multi-Session / Sanction type: Invitational (open)

Minimum: 50 swimmers / Maximum: 175 swimmers

All events will be seeded from slowest to fastest with mixed-gender and mixed ages.

#### ELIGIBILITY

This competition is open to all swimmers currently registered with Swimming Canada or a World Aquatics-affiliated club. There will be no qualifying or de-qualifying times.

#### ENTRY PROCESS

All entries must be submitted through the Swimming Canada online system.

Swimmer Deck Entries may be permitted by Meet Management. Deck entries must include proof that the swimmer is fully registered with Swimming Canada.

Swimmers are limited to a maximum of five (5) individual events.

**25 m Exhibition Events will not be officially timed.** This will provide the opportunity for exhibition swimmers to practice their race stroke in a competitive environment **without disqualification**.

It is recommended that teams only enter swimmers below the provincial standard, however there is no restriction based on the swimmer's level.

NT (no time) entries will not be accepted. If necessary, please use a coach-estimated time.

#### SCRATCHES

The Swim Alberta Scratch Rule will be in effect for this competition.

Scratch Deadline: **Monday, April 13, 2026**

Entry fees are non-refundable after the Scratch Deadline except with a medical note.

### OFFICIALS

Volunteers from visiting clubs may be required. Shadow positions may be available for officials who have completed Level 2 courses prior to the meet. ### THE SWEET ELIMINATOR

The top 5 swimmers in each age group and gender of the 50 m freestyle will qualify for The Sweet Eliminator. The last placed swimmer of each round will be eliminated with remaining racers moving on to the next round of sprint races until only one swimmer remains. The Sweet Eliminator results will not be uploaded.

# STETTLER SPRING SWEET SWIM MEET

## MEET PACKAGE - April 18, 2026

### MEET RULES

This meet will be conducted under published World Aquatics and/or World Para Swimming rules and regulations supplemented by published and approved Swimming Canada and Swim Alberta rules and regulations. In addition, this meet package shall outline all changes to and specific application of the published rules. Swim Alberta policies and procedures, where appropriate will also apply. Swimming Canada Competition Warm-Up Safety Procedures will be in effect at this meet.

### SAFE SPORT

All interactions between an athlete and an individual who is in a position of trust should normally, and wherever possible, be in an environment or space that is both “open” and “observable” to others.

### COMPETITION WARM-UP

Swimming Canada competition warm -up safety procedures will be in effect at this meet. The full details on the Competition Warm -Up can be found at <https://www.swimming.ca/rules-and-forms/>

### COMPETITION AND DIVING READINESS STANDARDS

Entry for the competition is limited to participants who have passed Swim Alberta’s Competition Swim Test. During the competition, swimmers should dive at the Dive Readiness Progression skill level they have achieved.

### DIVING RULES

Starts will be conducted from Starting Platforms (blocks) as per World Aquatics Facility Rule 16.1.4, 16.1.8 and Swimming Canada’s Swimming Rule 4.1.

### REQUIREMENT FOR TIME TRIAL SANCTIONS

A Time Trial sanction is intended for a record attempt and is limited to one (1) event with one (1) swimmer or one (1) relay team. No entry fees are permitted for Time Trials. All other items must follow the criteria set out in the Swim Alberta Competition Sanctioning Policy

### SWIMWEAR AT COMPETITIONS

All swimmers are permitted to race with the swimwear of their choosing at all competitions sanctioned by Swim Alberta. It is not required to declare the choice of swimwear to the Referee if the fabric of the swimwear is a permeable open mesh textile and would not reasonably be seen to create a technical advantage in terms of speed, buoyancy, or endurance.

### PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOGRAPY

To minimize risk, all photographs and video taken at Swimming Canada and Swim Alberta sanctioned competitions, whether taken by a professional photographer or videographer, spectator, team support staff or any other participant, must observe generally accepted standards of decency. Under no circumstances are cameras or other recording devices allowed in the area immediately behind the starting blocks during practice or competition starts, or in locker rooms, bathrooms, or any other dressing area. ### REFEREES

For multi-day heats and finals competitions, it is recommended that a Meet Referee be appointed. The Meet Referee must meet the requirements outlined in the Swim Alberta Role of the Meet Referee document, available on the Meet Manager Information Page <https://swimalberta.ca/community/officials/officials-resources/>

All other competitions are not required to appoint a Meet Referee.

Only the Meet Referee, if one is appointed, should be listed in the Meet Information Package. Session Referees should not be included in the meet package

Swim Clubs will be advised of any changes via email or Technical Bulletin prior to the start of the swim meet.
